

Lehigh Valley Pointer and Setter Club

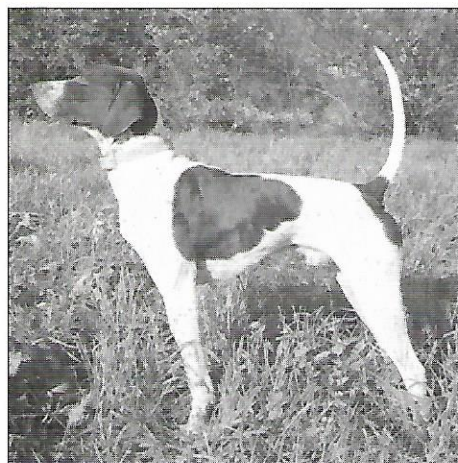

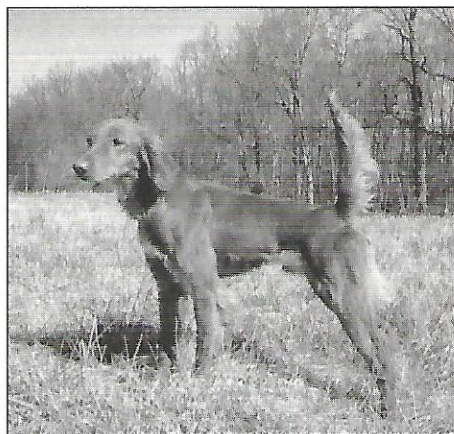
Three amateurs cleaned up in the Open Derby. Mister Big Guy was first with a strong race and stylish and
