#### JOE CANNON

1905 - 1992

Joe Cannon, veteran bird dog trainer from Elysburg, Pennsylvania died at the age of 87 on December 23, 1992.

Joe trained bird dogs over the course of five decades and in that time endeared himself to a multitude of clients for his skill, honesty, humor and shared love of a good bird dog.

While Joe trained every pointing breed, he is especially remembered as the linchpin of the Ned LeGrande program which sought to retrieve the Red Setter from oblivion as a bird dog and return it to the ability and prominence this breed enjoyed at the turn of the century. While Ned employed employed a number of professional trainers in this quest, Joe Cannon's kennel was the base of operations where hundreds of prospects were worked, developed and culled. From this project only a relatively few emerged as worthy of campaigning and then breeding to further the aim of producing a class horseback shooting dog.

Joe's role in this duo was to start the youngsters which Ned delivered literally by the truckload. Joe would develop those who had the right stuff so that Ned could take them back to Douglasville, polish them up and campaign them. Joe did the critical foundation work much like a farm system manager in baseball. He worked exclusively at this for a period during the 1950's and the venture produced dogs which Ned competed with success in the major shooting dog circuits of the East Coast.

Joe himself did guide Sulhamstead Norse D'Or to a win at the National Red Setter Championship stake at Delaware, Ohio in 1956 but he preferred training dogs to campaigning them. A highlight on Joe's calendar was the annual Indiantown Gap trials during the era when this was a part of the major circuit. The handlers and participants were folks he associated with and respected. He would recall these glorious days and all-age dogs frequently.

When Ned LeGrande reduced his interest in Red Setters in the early 1960's, Joe transitioned to working for the public. Raised in the coal region, Joe's early employment was naturally associated with coal mining. He was an earthy person and he and his devoted wife of over fifty years, Kit, were forever grateful that his bird dog vocation let him escape the hard, dirty and unhealthy life of a coal miner Joe had an Irish brogue and possessed that seemingly natural Irish trait for telling a good story and doing it with humor. Joe used his knowledge and skills for training bird dogs along with these personal traits to successfully train for the public over the next several decades. Joe always contended that the dogs were always easier to deal with than the owners.

My own association with Joe began in the late 60's when this "green-as-a-gate" (a typical Joe Cannon expression) bird dog enthusiast showed up at his place with a Red Setter pup produced from Ned LeGrande's

last two dogs and acquired from recent veterinary school grad, Dr. Roger Boser. After a five year hiatus, Joe was thrilled to have a competitive Red Setter and a pup was just his meat. In three weeks he had won an all breed puppy stake and we were both hooked. Over the next decade Joe became my mentor, advisor, bird dog trainer and most importantly, friend. He made many personal sacrifices to help me with my Red Dogs. We spent countless hours working dogs on the grounds adjoining the Valley Gun Club at Elysburg which Joe used over the last twenty-five years of his career.

For his contribution to the "Return of the Red Setter" the NRSFTC voted Joe its highest honor, making him an Honorary Life Member in 1976. Joe continued to take dogs and train them until he was well in his eighties. In these later years, Joe became a mentor to my friend Tom Gingher of Bloomsburg, Pa. Tom also found in Joe not only someone with a lifetime of knowledge about bird dogs and the people who own them, but a warm open man who was willing to share it. Joe found it fulfilling to see Tom become permanently established

as a professional trainer.

On one of my last visits with Joe, I told him about the Red Setters of the 90's. We both came to realize that The Purest Challenge has been won. Red Setters are class horseback shooting dogs. They have proved this by winning in Championship level competition and consistently in the best of shooting dog circuits. Particularly the accomplishments of Dr. Roger Boser and Paul Ober, the breed's most serious long-term and generous supporters in this quest, brought him satisfaction. While they were at one time the competition, they persisted and sacrificed until the seeming unattainable goal was achieved.

Words, words, words....they come easily when thinking of Joe. Words alone, however will never capture the relationship and bond we shared. My hope is that each of you in your bird dog world will establish a relationship like the one I shared with Joe, be it with a trainer, co-owner, or hunting buddy. My hope is also that you'll nurture that relationship and be able to savor it as I know I will in the years to come until that day Joe and I get together once again to run "Red" across the gun club grounds and then return to rest by the old well pump, reflecting on what a thrilling performance he'd given us today.


