### JOE CANNON

1905 - 1992

Joe Cannon, veteran bird dog trainer from Elysburg, Pennsylvania died at the age of 87 on December 23, 1992.

Joe trained bird dogs over the course of five decades and in that time endeared himself to a multitude of clients for his skill, honesty, humor and shared love of a good bird dog.

While Joe trained every pointing breed, he is especially remembered as the linchpin of the Ned LeGrande program which sought to retrieve the Red Setter from oblivion as a bird dog and return it to the ability and prominence this breed enjoyed at the turn of the century. While Ned employed employed a number of professional trainers in this quest, Joe Cannon's kennel was the base of operations where hundreds of prospects were worked, developed and culled. From this project only a relatively few emerged as worthy of campaigning and then breeding to further the aim of producing a class horseback shooting dog.

Ned LeGrande (retired and now living near Naples, Florida) and Joe Cannon were a duo that were hard to beat. Their efforts produced scores upon scores of winners in all-breed trials reported in the *American Field*. Open breed stakes were the only type trials they deemed important since they sought the highest class dogs and these trials were an opportunity to test their dogs against the recognized standard being set by pointers and setters. But winning was not their only goal as Ned and Joe wanted to encourage others to join in this effort to revive the Red Setter, which sportswriter Herm David described as *The Purest Challenge* in sportsdom. Both men were ambassadors for the breed. By sharing their knowledge and dogs they were able to get others to join them in this journey to take this slow, lumbering dog with the style of a cow and improve it so a Red Setter could stand proudly alongside pointers and English

setters in the winner's circle at the finest shooting dog competitions.

Joe's role in this duo was to start the youngsters which Ned delivered literally by the truckload. Joe would develop those who had the right stuff so that Ned could take them back to Douglassville, polish them up and campaign them. Joe did the critical foundation work much like a farm system manager in baseball. He worked exclusively at this for a period during the 1950's and the venture produced dogs which Ned competed with success in the major shooting dog circuits of the East Coast.

Joe himself did guide Sulhamstead Norse D'Or to a win at the National Red Setter Championship stake at Delaware, Ohio in 1956 but he preferred training dogs to campaigning them. A highlight on Joe's calendar was the annual Indiantown Gap trials during the era when this was a part of the major circuit. The handlers and participants were folks he associated with and respected. He would recall these glorious days and all-age dogs frequently.

When Ned LeGrande reduced his interest in Red Setters in the early 1960's, Joe transitioned to working for the public. Raised in the coal region, Joe's early employment was naturally associated with coal mining. He was an earthy person and he and his devoted wife of over fifty years, Kit, were forever grateful that his bird dog vocation let him escape the hard, dirty and unhealthy life of a coal miner. Joe had an Irish brogue and possessed that seemingly natural Irish trait for telling a good story and doing it with humor. Joe used his knowledge and skills for training bird dogs along with these personal traits to successfully train for the public over the next several decades. Joe always contended that the dogs were always easier to deal with than the owners.

My own association with Joe began in the late 60's when this "green-as-a-gate" (a typical Joe Cannon expression) bird dog enthusiast showed up at his place with a Red Setter pup produced from Ned LeGrande's



last two dogs and acquired from recent veterinary school grad, Dr. Roger Boser. After a five year hiatus, Joe was thrilled to have a competitive Red Setter and a pup was just his meat. In three weeks he had won an all breed puppy stake and we were both hooked. Over the next decade Joe became my mentor, advisor, bird dog trainer and most importantly, friend. He made many personal sacrifices to help me with my Red Dogs. We spent countless hours working dogs on the grounds adjoining the Valley Gun Club at Elysburg which Joe used over the last twenty-five years of his career.

Joe was a compelling raconteur, and I was enthralled with his knowledge and the lure of *The Purest Challenge*. Just as with LeGrande's dogs, Joe proved to be a master at starting young dogs. His reputation for this ability became his hallmark as a bird dog trainer. In the early 70's I moved away, but despite the distance, Joe remained vitally interested in how the Red Ones were doing. He continued to encourage me and was especially proud of Double Deal, a dog he broke, siring three first place Red Setter Futurity winners and my becoming Futurity Secretary and later President of the National Red Setter Field Trial Club. He took particular pleasure in any Red Setter win, for undoubtedly he had worked and had a hand in the development of many dogs in their pedigree which he could recall instantly and in depth. There is not a single class Red Setter today that does not trace its genealogy back to Ned LeGrande's program and the work of Joe Cannon.

For his contribution to the "Return of the Red Setter", the NRSFTC voted Joe its highest honor, making him an Honorary Life Member in 1976. Joe continued to take dogs and train them until he was well in his eighties. In these later years, Joe became a mentor to my friend Tom Gingham of Bloomsburg, Pa. Tom also found in Joe not only someone with a lifetime of knowledge about bird dogs and the people who own them, but a warm open man who was willing to share it. Joe found it fulfilling to see Tom become permanently established

as a professional trainer.

On one of my last visits with Joe, I told him about the Red Setters of the 90's. We both came to realize that *The Purest Challenge* has been won. Red Setters are class horseback shooting dogs. They have proved this by winning in Championship level competition and consistently in the best of shooting dog circuits. Particularly the accomplishments of Dr. Roger Boser and Paul Ober, the breed's most serious long-term and generous supporters in this quest, brought him satisfaction. While they were at one time the competition, they persisted and sacrificed until the seeming unattainable goal was achieved.

Words, words, words....they come easily when thinking of Joe. Words alone, however will never capture the relationship and bond we shared. My hope is that each of you in your bird dog world will establish a relationship like the one I shared with Joe, be it with a trainer, co-owner, or hunting buddy. My hope is also that you'll nurture that relationship and be able to savor it as I know I will in the years to come until that day Joe and I get together once again to run "Red" across the gun club grounds and then return to rest by the old well pump, reflecting on what a thrilling performance he'd given us today.

I think most of us know someone or ones that admire our dogs and probably hunt over one, but never got around to joining the Club. Let's bring those folks into the NRSFTC and insure that there will be quality Red Setters in the years to come. A strong NRSFTC is the only certainty that the field Red Setter will not once again slide into near oblivion as it nearly did forty-one years ago. To read the Joe Cannon eulogy and marvel at the awesome effort made by Ned LeGrande and Joe Cannon, along with the other pioneers such as Rusty Baynard ought to be the incentive to keep the NRSFTC strong for the future of the breed.

## REGION 2 RED SETTER AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP MID-ATLANTIC RED SETTER CLUB TRIALS

*Bearcats named Champion; Celtic's Ademption Runner-up*

If you're in the middle of the spring field trial season, your truck and trailer are mired in mud up to the hubs, your host seems to be spending as much time on the seat of his tractor pulling rigs out as he does on horseback, and there are an unusually large number of Red Setters on the grounds, you must be at the Reion 2 Red Setter Amateur Championship at Roger Boser's Seven Valleys, Pennsylvania farm. This reporter has covered this event three times now, and have been in attendance at all but a couple of the rest of the annual renewals and only once, last year, has the weather been comfortable throughout the entire weekend. Everyone seems to take the weather in stride, however, and we all enjoy ourselves for a few days.

Regular competitors at the Championship, other than Boser, usually include Paul Ober, Pennsylvania, Joe Edwards, North Carolina, Aaron Bixler and myself, Maryland, plus a few other Red Setter folks that come from time to time. Missed this year were regulars Nick Kaufman from nearby Pennsylvania and Bob White from Connecticut; we look forward to seeing them the next time. Attending for the first time was a long time Red Setter man and current President of the National Red Setter Field Trial Club, Dale Bruns and his lovely wife, from Indiana. One of their sons, now living in Wilkes-Barre, Pa. was there to watch Pop's dogs run. We thoroughly enjoyed visiting with them, and hope they make this event a regular stop during coming seasons.

The after running activities were again managed by Mary Boser and Mary Tracy with a happy hour and lasagna dinner Friday evening and a ham dinner Saturday evening. The delicious feed and festivities were again provided by the Club for everyone's enjoyment.

The judges for the championship were two long time



bird dog men who have piloted their share of winners. John Buckley hails from Maryland and was a professional trainer several years ago. Roger Hoover is a professional trainer from northern Pennsylvania. This was a rough stake to judge, but they were more than equal to the task.

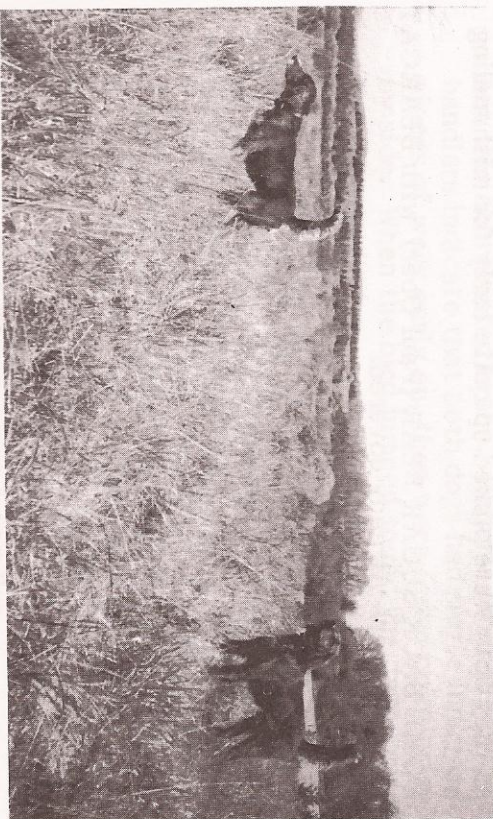
Scenting conditions for most of the stake were, to put it mildly, less than ideal. Wet birds and a cold northeast wind compounded the problem. Previously proven dogs that habitually render top drawer performances were going birdless, or worse.

### The Winners

The Championship was won by Bearcat, running in the 4th. brace for proud owner Roger Boser. Bear and his bracemate, Comeback Sugar Bear, took off in high gear and finished the same way. The stylish veterans toured the country far ahead and were first rewarded as they reached the far end of the pines above the first creek, where Bearcat was found pointing in cover to the right with Sugar Bear backing nicely. Sent on, they topped the next hill and dropped down into the valley, where Bearcat struck a second time with his usual grand style. In the pines near the water hole Bearcat was found pointing a third time, but the hawks had beaten him to the bird and all that was left was a pile of feathers. Sent on, he soon was found backing Sugar Bear where she'd pointed the sent of a dead bird. The scenario was repeated shortly thereafter, Bearcat carding another back of Sugar's barren stand. Bearcat finished the hour strong.

The 2nd. brace produced the eventual runner-up in Celtic's Ademption, piloted by owner Paul Ober. She was braced with Desperado, and the pair took off like a shot, reached the creek in no time, and were spotted racing ahead toward the ridge beyond while we were still negotiating the downhill slope of the breakaway field. Desperado was found pointing proudly not far from where he was last seen. Unfortunately, the flushing attempt and subsequent relocations netted nothing

but a wide separation between the dogs which was never closed. As it happened, this reporter stayed with Desperado, who carded two more nice finds but was picked up after suffering a second unproductive. Aaron Bixler reported that Celtic's Ademption finished the hour in fine fashion, rimming the field edges nicely and extending her range to the outer limits where the course allowed, tallying two stylish finds of the dug-up variety along the way.

### The Running

COME BACK FIRE BOY (Paul Ober) with COME BACK DIXIE GIRL (Joe Edwards) The weather was cold and windy as we got underway at 8:00 a.m. Both dogs broke straightaway and soon disappeared as they made their way down the hill to the first creek crossing. Dixie suffered an unproductive stand early, but soon atoned for it with a pretty stand in the pines near the water



hole. Edwards elected to pick her up near the end of the hour when she'd had no further work and was tiring perceptibly. Having been separated early, we'd lost sight and sound of Fire Boy. It was reported that he had a single find which he handled well, but was wont to run down the middle of the large fields rather than the preferred edges that were more likely to produce birds. DESPERADO (Roger Boser) with CELTIC'S ADEPTION (Paul Ober) Already covered.

CELTIC'S SUSTAINED APPEAL (Paul Ober) with SNEAKERS (Roger Boser) This pair had their running shoes on early, but their exuberance cost them dearly, as they both were picked up quite early for mishandling birds.

COME BACK SUGAR BEAR (Paul Ober) with BEARCAT (Roger Boser) Already covered.

YONDER (Dale Bruns) with WINTERSTORM (Aaron Bixler) Another far reaching pair, they wasted little time in locating birds as Storm was first to score prior to first creek crossing, all in order as Yonder backed nicely. After covering the ridge above the creek without contact, they reversed roles as Yonder pointed with grand style in bottom, Storm honoring. Five minutes later Storm suffered an unproductive, with Yonder again backing. Both dogs finished the hour with strength to spare. Yonder the wider, but without further bird contact.

CELTIC'S SEX APPEAL (Paul Ober) with PETTIBONE (Roger Boser) The stylish Sex Appeal was getting the job done as she raced ahead in search of the elusive bob-white. She scored first at the far end of the ridge across the first creek; nice work. Working along the autumn olive rows in the bottom, Pettibone was next to score with a fine piece of work. Half a dozen minutes later, following a second pretty stand, "Casey" took the liberty of jumping after the bird and was picked up. Pettibone had come in for a back under caution, and finished the hour strong but without further bird work.

PRO MOTION (Dale Bruns) with COME BACK LITTLE CHOO (Paul Ober) This duo got things stirred up early as Choo pointed along hillside prior to first creek, Pro Motion backing with style. In rough country near the end of the first half, Pro Motion suffered an unproductive stand, which Choo backed. Choo was picked up shortly thereafter as he wasn't getting the job done to Ober's satisfaction, and Pro Motion finished the hour alone but without further action.

COME BACK BECK (Joe Edwards) with THRILLING TOURS SPEEDING TICKET (Mark Gaughan) We ran out of horse power before we ran out of dogs, so didn't see this abbreviated brace. Reports from the involved handlers indicate that both dogs had single independent pieces of work early on, then were found pointing side by side. When the bird jumped so did the dogs, bringing the curtain down.
