

Bird Dog Field Trials Run This Week End

The week end will witness a rather unique event in field trial history. It is the National Red Setter Gun Dog Championship, and it will be held at Kelleys Island, where the pheasants are thicker than fleas on a wild rabbit.

This trial is for Irish Setters only. The sponsoring club has split away from American Kennel Club registrations and activities, and is holding the trial under the rules of the Field Dog Stud Book.

There will be three complete courses, permitting hour heats. Finds must be on native game —pheasants—and the abundance of them may make many a good dog go high, wide and too handsome.

Curtis W. Miles of Cleveland, one of America's most popular field judges, and Dr. Richard Jackson of Toledo will judge most stakes. Milton Kerr of Sandusky and Mrs. Edwin Berol of Bedford Hills, N. Y., will judge the novice stake.
