Flint River Field Trial Club

THE Flint River Club renewed its autumn trial with a full slate of amateur and open stakes November 12-13 at the J. L. Lester Wildlife Management Area outside Cedartown, Ga. Professional trainers Daryl Thomas, Sr. and Daryl Thomas, Jr. of Rockstory Kennels in Dawson, Ga., traveled north to judge our Amateur Shooting Dog Stakes. Daryl Thomas, Jr. was joined by Ronnie Rogers of New Market, Tenn., to judge the Amateur Derby. Thomas Perry

of Newnan, Ga., and Joe Rentz of Fayetteville, Ga., adjudicated the Open Derby and Open Shooting Dog. The judges devoted their full attention to all the competitors and their decisions were well received. The club and the handlers are grateful to them for their efforts.

A special thanks to Chris Kahlan, president of the Flint River Club and trial chairman, for this trial would not happen if not for Chris' efforts and attention to all the details.

We experienced extreme ranges in temperatures and conditions from a Saturday morning low of 28° with frost to warm sunny afternoons in the mid-60s which made scenting conditions unpredictable and difficult at times.

All in all it was a highly suc-

cessful trial with 45 entries, lots of bird work, plenty of kids running around having a good time and a nice-sized gallery riding to watch the braces.

Houston's Blue Diamond, a well-built setter owned and handled by Ross Leonard, was first in the Amateur Shooting Dog with a bold and forward race and four solid finds. "Sam" displayed exemplary manners and showed a nice rapport with his handler. Rob Boot and his classy pointer High Noon's Elhew McGee challenged the winner and earned second with three finds and an exceptional shooting dog performance. McGee's posture on his first find exuded class as he pointed his birds from a distance but showed no letdown during an extended flushing attempt that finally produced. His second find was equally impressive. After making a long cast down the left edge of the dove field the pointer was rewarded with a well-mannered find. Steve Montgomery's young pointer Jen and Juice captured third place with three finds and a very snappy ground application.

The judges made note of other strong performances including Nade, handled by owner Joe Rentz; Arnold Hall's pointer Bill which was braced with an exciting young pointer Ben which is owned and handled by Lavon King.

Despite the cool temperatures, scenting conditions were poor for the Amateur Derby. Melissa Dobson ganered first with her pointer Bud Hawk Jet which had one well-located find. Bud pointed with great style and intensity and demonstrated impeccable manners. His bird work was matched with a mature forward race. The judges noted they have high expectations for this dog. Bobby Fox's supremely athletic young pointer Three Rivers put down a good forward race to garner second place. Rivers ran with a high snappy tail and hunted everywhere he needed to be. Randy Marsh was awarded third with Caladen's Dancing River. "Remi" hunted hard and delivered a terrific race. Showing impressive range, she went pleasingly with handler Marsh and demonstrated nice rapport with him.

Diamond repeated his success from the previous day, earning first in the Open Shooting Dog Stake. The judges commented that "Sam" exhibited a powerful ground race. His four finds were well to the front and independently located with virtually no handling.

Second was well earned by Rockstory Storm, an impressively built pointer owned by Marlene Thomas and smartly handled by Daryl Thomas, Sr. "Bud" put down an athletic race and was rewarded with four nice finds. Chaperon, five-year old Irish setter owned and handled by Ross Leonard, placed third. Chaperon had three flawless finds where he matched his impressive intensity with impeccable manners.

Fred Rayl piloted Ridgeway's Journevman to first place in the Open Derby. "Bubba" demonstrated a bird-finding clinic with multiple finds and acceptable Derby manners. Ross Leonard was awarded second with Palomar, a young setter that scored one find. Blackhawk Buzzsaw, owned and handled by Steve Montgomery, was named third.

We thank everyone for participating and would like to encourage everyone to come back in the spring when we will renew the Pat LaBree Memorial Amateur Shooting Dog Classic.

Shadow's Bewitched ran real well with good bird work to win the Open

The Open Shooting Dog had several good performances with Lumber River Buck having three finds and a strong race to earn the win. Call Fire's Illusion was second and the consistent Night Fire was third. Both dogs pushed the winner. Three braces of the Open Shooting Dog ran the second day.

After a delay in order to complete the Open Shooting Dog, the Amateur All-Age began. Bittersweet Sensation, a very energetic pointer female owned and handled by our good friend Bruce Norton of nearby Norman Park, Ga., put on quite a show running the course with three letter perfect finds. She was named the winner. The setter Shake's Tag was second, and Jeff Walker's Seminole Buck, handled by William Berryhill, was third.
