8. Discussion of trophies as to the quality and amount expended for these trophies. The amount spent on trophies including engraving for the past few trials has been approximately \$150.00. We expect to spend \$25.00 to \$30.00 more than this in the future to furnish permanent trophy for the Duke award and possibly increase trophy cost. We should clarify the ownership of rotating trophy - after being won three times should it be replaced by the club or the expense of the winner.

In order to save time I am sending this letter to Marge and all of the directors. We certainly will appreciate your time and thoughts on the above and strongly encourage each of you to take an active part in helping the Red Setter Club this year.

As you realize several of the above items will require a bit of research and some serious thought. In order to try to get the "ball rolling", I would like to ask that the following directors take particular interest and expound on the items listed by their names below:

- Item # 4 - I would like for Cliff Bean and Ed Schnettler to outline printed duties of field trial chairman.
- Item # 5 - Again I would like to call on Ed Schnettler, Cliff Bean and Dee Johnson to collaborate on the defining of stakes.
- Item # 6 - The publishing of the leaflet handout is something I feel will benefit the club and certainly give encouragement to new enthusiast. I would like to ask Dave Hassinger, E. J. Lewis, Dr. VanWye and Jack Ullrich to take this job with Dave Hassinger as chairman. I hope you can come up with a rough draft of your recommendations and an approximate cost of same.

Item # 7 - Will all directors give us your opinion on holding a trial at Hawfield or in the Eastern part of the country for the coming spring.

Item # 8 - Again we ask that all directors comment on the trophies.

I realize this is an unusual way to announce the appointment of the directors but as time is such a priority in all of our busy schedules I hope this letter will be received with williness to do something for the National Red Setter Club. Please pardon my abruptness for not writing each of you a personal letter. As President of the club this year I would like to co-ordinate our efforts and intelligent suggestions from the directors and make the mechanical part of running this club a perpetuating thing so that the minor details are not left to doubt.

In case you have not received the above stationary, I think it would be very appropriate to put the officers and directors on the stationary as most of the other clubs do this. At least this might save time explaining why you forwarded information for the various directors to answer.

The business that we need to resolve for the coming year is as follows:

1. Selecting field trial chairman for the coming year.
2. Selecting field trial secretary.
3. Approve trial budget as well as outlining of budget for the year.
4. Printed duties of trial chairman - outlined in specific details.
5. Explanation and definition of the type of stakes as well as the championship so that owners, handlers and judges will understand.
6. Publishing a leaflet handout outlining (a) history, (b) purpose, (c) accomplishments of the club (d) other general information to interest and help the growth of Red Setter as a bird dog.
7. Selection of field trial grounds for spring of 1968 (Jack Ulrich is working on getting Hawfield which is in Northern Virginia and is possibly one of the best field trial grounds available and there are an abundance of native quail.
