

"The bird dog world is not unlike any other game and yet there are things that happen that make you wonder and scratch your head. We somehow seem to lose and gain participants at disproportionate numbers. There is, however, good news in this regard and I would like all to be aware of the return to the game of one Gary Dowdy.

"For those who never had the opportunity to know Gary, let me tell you who and why we should be pleased to have him back. The name 'Montana' should say much to those who have been in the game for forty years. Gary is from North Carolina, Manteo, on the Outer Banks, not a place you would expect to develop some of the most outstanding bird dogs that won many trials.

"I have much to thank Gary for but I will not bore you with personal details. Gary took me to my first horseback trial, which was at Hoffman, N. C. Several things stand out about that trial. One was that I was able to see, shake hands with and observe the great trainers of that area. I distinctly remember that the trial was cancelled because of one of the worst snowstorms ever to hit the area. How we made it home is beyond me or Gary's wildest imagination. We literally drug the horse trailer back to Manteo, N. C.

"Montana Sue was in the box as well as a no-name dog by the name of Champagne's Frank. For \$75 dollars I was given the opportunity to run Frank in the trial. He had six finds in 30 minutes and my horse managed to rare up and bust my nose as I was trying to get to Frank and another find. When the judge rode up and asked me if I had a clothes pin in my saddle bag, being a 'Dumb Cajun,' I responded, 'What

"Back to Gary. He and I enjoyed competing in the birdfield trials of that time. His dogs were very stylish and stone broke. Gary's departure from the game coincided with the untimely death of Montana Rod, which may have been the finest Derby dog of all time had he not had a short life. Please welcome back to the game Gary when you run across him. He will be at Dr. Aubrey Morgan's camp in Timberlake, S. D., this summer.
